It is with pleasure that I announce the Nineteenth Annual Meeting of the Third District of the V.F.W.C., which will convene at 10 A. M. at Lynchburg Woman's Club, Lynchburg, Va., Wednesday, October 28, 1942, with the Lynchburg Woman's Club as our hostess.

Due to transportation difficulties, it will no doubt be necessary for some of our clubwomen attending the meeting to arrive in Lynchburg the afternoon of October 27. In view of this, the hostess club is providing entertainment for those guests. You are, therefore requested to notify Mrs. G. R. Boatwright; our State Vice President, Mrs. Northington, who will follow her talk with a short question period on the problems of increasing our membership and organizing new clubs;—and others of equal prominence. Special musical numbers will be provided by our District Chairman of Music, Mrs. B. C. Collins at both morning and afternoon sessions.

There will be a joint session with the Juniors and Seniors through the address of our State President and the Junior Vice-President, — Miss Marjorie Branch, then the Juniors will withdraw to another room at the Club House for their own session. They will have a Junior table at luncheon.

In accordance with the vote taken by the Executive Committee of the V.F.W.C., the Club Institutes held in the spring, as has been customary, have been cancelled. We hope all Clubs in the Third District will have a Club Institute instead.
