HISTORICAL PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY

Your Committee appointed to report on the term "Historical Proof," respectfully reports that proof must be authentic to be of value; and presents the following as what in the opinion of the Committee constitutes authentic proof of eligibility to membership in the Children of the Confederacy:

1—Affidavit from Chairman, State Historical Commission; or

2—Certified proof from War Department, in Washington, D. C.; or

3—Affidavit from Director of Children of the Confederacy Chapter that the paper of the applicant is an exact copy of a registered Children of the Confederacy paper, provided it meets with the provision of the By-Laws as to eligibility and contains sufficient historical data, with certified proof of relationship to the same ancestor.

4—Current history as recorded in some published work of recognized authenticity; or

5—Data from tombstone, provided it contains authentic proof of Confederate service. Location of grave being given. Relationship to ancestor may be proved by probate records in matters pertaining to estates.

6—A certified copy of a Confederate Veteran's pension application on which pension has been granted, with certified proof of applicant's relationship to pensioner; or

7—A certified copy of registered U. D. C. member's application paper, provided the U. D. C. application meets with the provisions of the By-Laws as to eligibility, contains sufficient historical data, with certified proof of relationship to the same ancestor; or

8—A certified copy of ancestor's Cross of Honor application on which the Cross has been granted, provided it contains authentic proof of Confederate service, with sworn statement of relationship to the receiver of the Cross.

9—Sworn statement of one or more persons with positive knowledge, not hearsay, of "Material Aid" or "Civil Service" on which applicant bases eligibility, and a full account of the "Material Aid" must be given.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Those eligible to membership are boys and girls from infancy to eighteen years of age who are lineal descendants or nieces, grand-nieces, nephews, grand-nephews of the men and women who honorably served the Confederate States of America.

Section 2. Membership shall cease at eighteen years of age, when the girls may apply for membership in a Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, and the boys may apply for membership in the Sons of Confederate Veterans.

Section 3. When a member in good standing wishes to transfer membership to another chapter, the Director General on request, approved by the Chapter Director, shall issue to said member a demit on a form provided for that purpose.

UNITED DAUGHTERS OF THE CONFEDERACY®
UDC BYLAWS
Article V - Section 6a**

Section 6a - Upon invitation a young woman member of the Children of the Confederacy 16 years or older may transfer to a Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy. The Transfer Applications shall be in quadruplicate, each originally signed, filled out by the Chapter from which the member is transferring, and shall be sent to the Business Office for official stamp. The Business Office shall send the applications to the Third Vice President General for signature. The Third Vice President General shall return one copy to the Children of the Confederacy Chapter from which the member is transferring. The Third Vice President General shall send the original and two copies to the UDC Chapter to which the applicant is transferring.

A young man may transfer to the Sons of Confederate Veterans subject to the By-Laws of the Sons of Confederate Veterans.

HISTORICAL PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY

Proof of ancestor service to the Confederate States of America may be provided, if available, upon request from one of the following sources:

- Chapter or Division Registrar.
- UDC Business Office: From records of military service compiled from registered applications and veterans' files, upon request of Chapter Registrar and payment of research fee and self addressed stamped envelope.
- State Departments of Archives and History Confederate Records, if certified.
- General Services Administration, National Archives and Record Service, 8th and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20408.
- An authoritative Publication: Give name of author, volume, page number, year of publication, location of library. Provide certified copy of pertinent data.
- Data from tombstone, name of cemetery and location, please certify as to authenticity. Enclose a photograph if possible.
- Proof of applicant's relation to Veteran (birth, marriage and death certificates, where applicable.)

Eligibility

Those eligible for membership are boys and girls from infancy through the General convention of their eighteenth birthday who are lineal or collateral descendants of such men and women who served honorably in the Confederate Army, Navy, Civil Service or gave Material Aid to the cause, or those who are lineal or collateral descendants of members of the United Daughters of the Confederacy and the Sons of Confederate Veterans whose papers are acceptable by the present requirements for membership. Adopted children are not eligible for membership by virtue of the adoptive parents' bloodline, but solely by virtue of the biological parents.

Applicants providing lineage to an ancestor who took an Oath of Allegiance prior to April 9, 1865, shall not be eligible for membership. If proof of further service is available, thereby nullifying the Oath of Allegiance, the applicant shall be considered eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IV
Membership**

SECTION 4:

- Applicants for Active membership shall fill out three original application forms or one original and two photocopies of the same and shall be accepted as prescribed in General, Division, and Chapter By-laws.
- All three applications, whether original or photocopies, shall bear original signatures.
- As of November, 1999, no requirement for notarization of the application is required. This will apply to all places in Bylaws now requiring notarization of applications.
