

On this site in Roseland, 3 homes once stood. I'm standing on the ⁹ site of a fourth taking the picture. Lovington is toward the horizon about 10 miles. On the far right in the distance can be seen a large home tipped on its side. We'll get closer.

This is the home of the Harvey family. It was washed from its nearby foundations and tipped on its side. After the flood Mr Harvey had to stand armed-guard to keep looters from scavenging what little he had left.

This is the home of the Kidd family. It was once opposite the Harvey home. In the foreground is the upper section. The lower portion is in the background at the far right. The family decided to stay together and if the worst came, they would perish as a family. They moved to the upper story, and when the water came up there, they ^{Got up} ~~set~~ on table^s. They prayed. They survived.

Here the rear of the Kidd house can be seen. The car in the garage is embedded in weeds and reeds. The cesspool is to the left and was lifted by the flood waters, out of its bed. The Harvey house is in the background.

The garden plot at the rear of the Kidd home is shown here. The washer in the field is filled with weeds packed there by the flood waters.

This is another view of the Kidd home, top portion to the left. The Harvey home is near the center beyond the trees. The water streamed across the road which turns left at this point.

The Tye River flowed behind the Kidd home. ^{I took this picture} ~~I'm standing at~~ ^{AT NORMAL WATER} the water level. Note how high in the trees the debris was lifted by the ^{FLOOD} ~~water~~^s.
