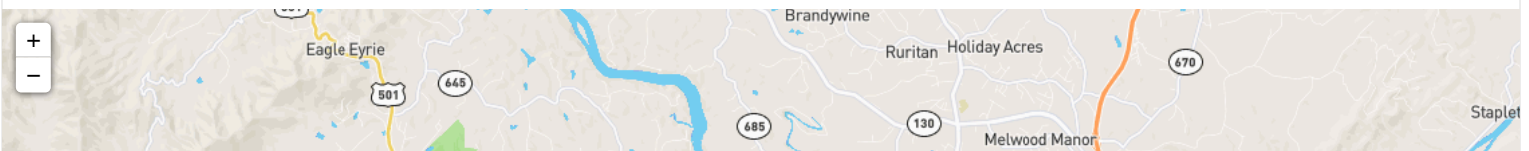
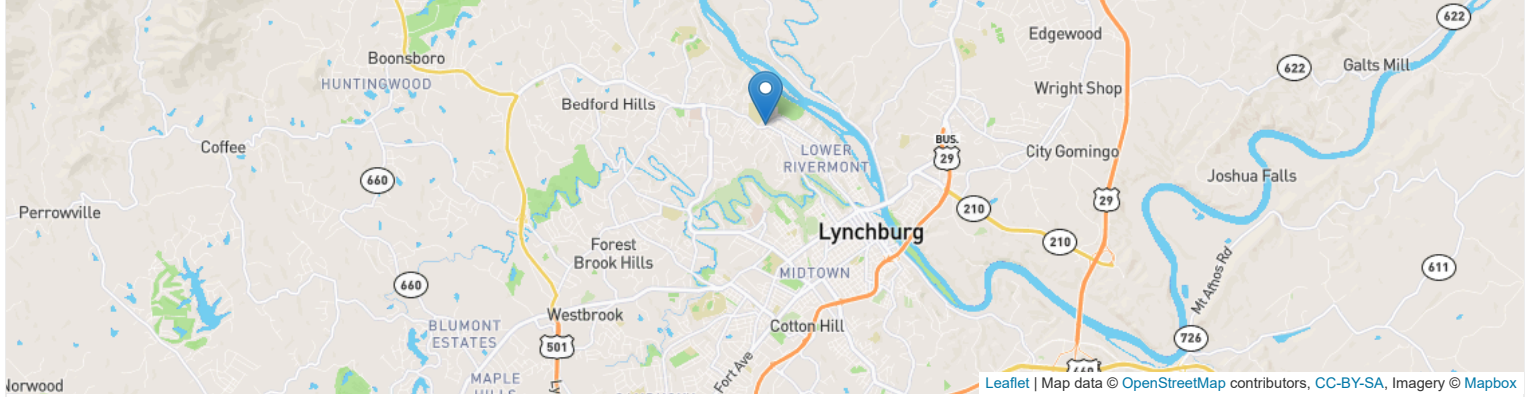

Anecdotal Information	<p>Interview with Joanne & George Caylor on June 9, 2010: Joanne and George Caylor moved to Lynchburg from Germany in 1987 after reading an article placing Lynchburg as one of the safest cities in the 1980s. They liked the area and eventually settled on buying the home on Rivermont. The house was built in 1915 and used by Randolph-Macon Woman's College as a home for their presidents starting with William Webb, until 1983 when they sold it. The former president's house has hosted celebrities such as Pearl S. Buck and Elizabeth Taylor, as well as hosting President Gerald Ford for breakfast. When this house was sold in 2021, it ceased functioning as a Bed and Breakfast.</p>
