Assistant Surgeon, July 21. 1861 till April 9. 1865. For 2 years Dr. Winston had charge of wards in the hospitals in Charlottesville scripts for service.

Va. Reg. (Inf.) Taken prisoner near close of the war and sent to Ft Delaware, where he suffered many hardships.

W. F. Whittier enlisted in the Ly Home Guard transferred to Wise Troop of Cavalry, serving till close of war: was paroled April 25. 1865. Grand-dau. of Com Gen Curtis U.S. Army, afterwards he refused to take the iron clad oath & was in consequence forced to give up his office.
