ONE HUNDRED YEARS OF SERVICE

One hundred years ago a school was founded in Georgetown, Texas. That school was Southwestern University, the

oldest institution of higher learning in the Lone Star State.

One hundred years ago Texas was an independent republic, the wild, rough country of the pioneer, where pistols

spoke with deadly swiftness and howie knives flashed in the sun. In fact, one of the regulations in the catalogue of that young college in Georgetown was that all students upon arriving on the campus should deposit their pistols with the president at once!

Today, after one hundred years of service to Methodism and the entire southwest, Southwestern University has celebrated its centennial anniversary. This school has trained leaders in church, state, and business and has left its imprint for good upon every phase of life. The name Southwestern has become a household word in thousands of Texas homes.

In this centennial year Southwestern University points to many recent improvements on its campus, including a new library and gymnasium. Substantial increases in the school's financial resources have also been recorded in recent years.

Southwestern is a fully accredited, coeducational senior college with an average enrolment of more than 600 students. It is one of the forty-five colleges and universities belonging to the former Southern branch of The Methodist Church.

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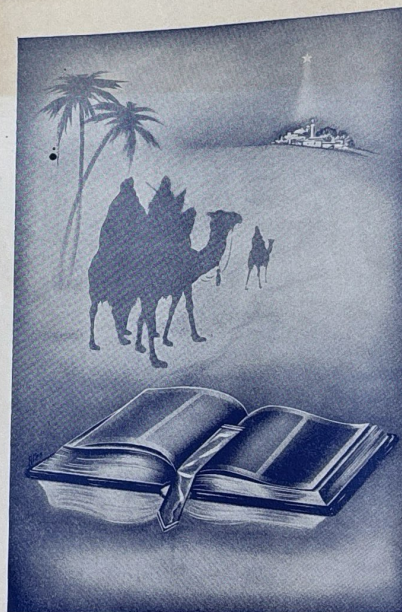
