Hancock volunteered at the beginning of the war - He was only in the Army a short time before he was sent home on account of ill-health - After a few weeks he again volunteered and was made 1<sup>st</sup> Lieut. of Co. G - 56 - Va Infantry - which was a part of Gen Hunter's brigade Snodgrass' Corps Pickett's Division - He served here until end of war and was in the battles around Petersburg and Richmond.

② J. E. Legrand was a 1<sup>st</sup> Lieut. of Co. H. Second Va Cavalry He enlisted at Appo-  
 C. H. and was in all the principal battles of Northern Va. - He was wounded on retreat from Richmond four days before the surrender while on a scouting expedition down near Richmond he suddenly came upon some Union soldiers sitting around a camp fire. He captured the camp and marched them back to the camp - He used to tell an interesting little incident of his army life said during a battle his horse was killed and soon afterwards he and his companion came upon a Union ambulance whose driver was in the ambulance asleep - They unhitched the mules and rode back to camp without making the driver.

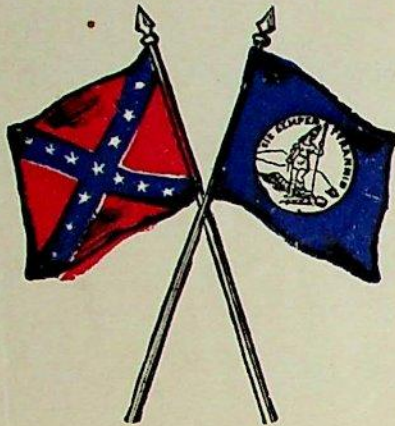

He was taken prisoner and carried to Baltimore to the West Building Hospital for six weeks, from there he was exchanged to City Point near

Petersburg. His arm was amputated  
twice. He recovered and has been  
an active man all these 43 years.  
He is in good health, active and  
strong yet.

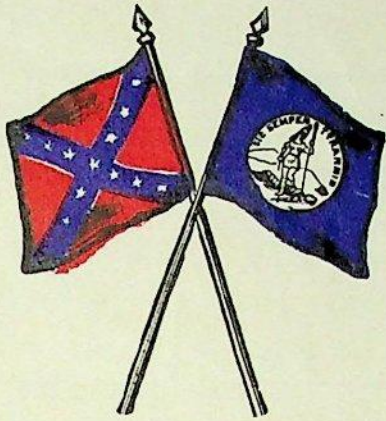
