ELIGIBILITY
 Those ELIGIBLE for membership are women not less than 16 years of age who are lineal or collateral descendants (wives, sisters, daughters, granddaughters, nieces) of men and women who served honorably in the Army, Navy, or Civil Service of the Confederate States of America, or gave material aid to the cause; and women who are lineal descendants of members or former members of the organization, provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the organization.
 No applicant whose ancestor took the Oath of Alliance prior to April 9, 1865 shall be considered eligible.

MEMBERSHIP
ADMISSION TO MEMBERSHIP shall be through a chapter.
 An applicant for MEMBERSHIP shall be endorsed by two members of a chapter in writing to whom the application shall be referred. She shall be admitted to membership as prescribed in the chapter by-laws and shall be sent application blanks in triplicate.
 The applicant shall fill out three U. D. C. application blanks, giving full name of Confederate ancestor or relative, and enclosing proof of his service and have papers notarized with seal.
 The completed applications shall be returned to chapter registrar, accompanied by the required fees and dues, and after being properly signed and dated by chapter members shall be sent to the Registrar-General through the Division Registrar.
 If the application is approved, the member shall be registered; one copy of application being filed in the Business Office, and two copies returned to Division Registrar who shall file one copy and return one copy to Chapter Registrar. This shall constitute notice of enrollment.
 In chapters where there is no Division, the chapter registrar shall send papers, fees and dues to the Registrar-General.
 A member admitted on or after September 1, shall be credited for the next succeeding Calendar year.
REFUNDS. If applications are not approved, all fees and dues shall be returned to the applicant, with the exception of \$1.00 to cover costs of mailing. (Chapters may reimburse applicant in full.)

CERTIFICATE OF MEMBERSHIP
CERTIFICATES. Each registered member shall be entitled to a Certificate of Membership, duly attested by the President-General and Registrar-General, to which shall be attached the Seal of the United Daughters of the Confederacy.
 Signatures on all certificates shall be of those holding office on the date of acceptance of the applicant into membership.
 Certificates shall be forwarded from the Business Office to Division Presidents for signature, thence to Chapter Presidents, before presentation to the members.

BY-LAWS—MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE I.

CERTIFICATE OF MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE VIII.

Section 1. Certificate shall be issued by the Registrar-General to Division Presidents and Chapter Registrars, provided the Initiative Fee, Certificate Fee and per-capita tax have been paid.

Applicants shall fill out their application blanks, attaching the full and complete record of their service in the Confederate States Army, Navy, Civil Service, or Material Aid rendered the Southern Confederacy. This record shall be submitted to the Registrar-General, who will examine the same to substantiate the claim of eligibility. All papers must be certified to before a Notary.

The application shall be duly signed by Chapter Officers named in blanks, giving the date of admission to Chapter. Each applicant shall give an affidavit, attesting her full name and marital status (if married), and correct address.

All applications shall be sent to the Registrar-General, through the Division Registrar after they are recorded, accompanied by \$1.25 for Initiative Fee, 25 cents Certificate of Membership and 30 cents additional for per-capita tax.

The first Co. to enter "The War Between the States" as an organized unit from the County of Appomattox was organized by Dr. William Henry Abbitt. This was Co. B L Regiment Infantry, Wise Legion (46 Va. Inf) C. S. Army which went into active service June 19, 1861 at Appomattox C. H. Va. This was said to be the largest Co. in the Confederate Army and it maintained its identity throughout the entire conflict. Dr. Abbitt led this Co. as Captain until April 12, 1862 at which time he was wounded and while recovering from these wounds he suffered a very severe attack of typhoid fever and was invalided home. In 1863 Dr. Abbitt, before he was physically able, returned to the army, but not as Capt of his beloved Co. which was his cherished desire. His skill as a physician resulted in his being drafted where his services were mostly needed at the time, which was as a member of the Physicians Examining Board located at Farmville, Va. In this capacity he served through the remainder of the war. Dr. Abbitt's home and also his Father's home (both within five miles of the battlefields) were used as Confederate hospitals and thus his immediate family had opportunity of giving personal services. Mrs. Abbitt aided in caring for the sick and wounded as they were brought from the nearby battlefield. The two oldest sons Aurelius William Abbitt (father of applicant) and Chas. Talliferro Plunkett Abbitt, who were quite small, being nine and seven years of age respectively, spent most of their time carrying provisions from their home to the soldiers as they passed through on trains. Their faithfulness and general demeanor endeared them to the soldiery, who affectionally dubbed them the "Peony Boys" (This name suggesting ~~faithfulness and general demeanor~~ ~~faithfulness and general demeanor~~ itself from the fact in the spring of the year they always carried peonies along with provisions while attending the soldiers). When Dr. Abbitt had to leave his Co. his first two successors were Capt. Hannah and Jennings Wise (son of Gov. Henry A. Wise) and both were killed in action, the latter at Roanoke Island. The third Capt. of this Co. was George W. Abbitt (brother of Capt. W. H. Abbitt) who later became Colonel.

BY-LAWS—MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE I.

Membership.—Those women not less than sixteen years of age who are eligible to membership are the women who are the widows, wives, daughters, or sisters of men who were members of the Confederate Army, Navy or Civil Service, or of those men unfit for active duty who loyally gave aid to the Cause and such women who are the legal descendants of those members whose papers are correctly registered.

Northern women having no male relative who served the Confederate Army since 1865 and through this means becoming a member of the Southern Confederate Aid Society, or who have been designated "by adoption" placed upon their certificate of membership and upon the Registrar's books and in all rosters shall be designated "by adoption" and members being entitled to all honors and privileges of members of the Southern Confederate Aid Society, General Organization, Division or Chapter and that of transmitting this honor to members of her family, except to her children of a Confederate father. The honor dies with her if she has no children.

Irregular members (those members admitted upon records of in-laws, sons-in-law, or other relatives) shall be entitled to all honors and privileges of this organization except holding an office or chairmanship in the General Organization.

CERTIFICATE OF MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE VIII.

Section 1. Certificate shall be issued by the Registrar-General to Division Presidents and Chapter Presidents where there are no Divisions, as soon as eligibility has been proven, provided the Initiation Fee, Certificate Fee and per-capita tax have been paid.

Applicants shall fill out three application blanks, giving the full name of Confederate ancestor or relative, giving an authentic record of service, with sworn statement of relationship to the applicant, verified by one of the seven Rulers of Eligibility as given in Art. I, to substantiate the claim of eligibility. All papers must be certified to before a Notary.

The application shall be duly signed by Chapter Officers named in the application and submitted to the Registrar-General. Each applicant shall sign her petition for membership giving her full maiden name and married name (if married), and correct address. The Registrar-General, through the Registrar, shall forward the application to the Registrar-General, Division Registrar after they are recorded, accompanied by \$1.25 for Initiation Fee, 25 cents Certificate of Membership and 20 cents additional for per-capita tax.

(Checks must be made payable to the Registrar-General)

HISTORICAL PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY

1—Affidavit from Chairman, State Historical Commission (or Department).

2—Certified proof from the War Department in Washington, D. C.; or

3—The record on any registered application paper in the General File stamped "Official Record on File."

4—Current history as recorded in some published work of recognized authenticity; or

5—Data from tombstone, provided it contains authentic proof of Confederate service. Location of grave being given. Relationship to ancestors shall be proved by probate records in matters pertaining to estate; or

6—A certified copy of a Confederate Veteran's pension application on which pension has been granted with certified proof of applicant's relationship to pensioner; or

7—A certified copy of ancestor's Cross of Honor application on which the Cross has been granted, provided it contains authentic proof of Confederate service, with sworn statement of relationship to the receiver of the Cross.

BY-LAWS—MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE I

Sec. 1.—Those women not less than 18 years of age entitled to membership are the women who are the widows, wives, mothers, sisters, nieces, grand nieces, and lineal descendants of such men as served honorably in the Confederate Army, Navy, or Civil Service, or of those men unit for active duty who loyally gave aid to the Cause. Also Southern women who can give proof of personal service or loyal aid to the Southern Cause during the war, and lineal descendants or nieces of such women wherever living. Northern women having no male relative who served the Confederate States of America in the War between the States, 1861-1865, and having themselves performed no special service to man, but having married a Confederate soldier, and who are the wives, mothers, sisters, nieces, grand nieces, and lineal descendants of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, shall have the words, "by adoption," placed upon their certificates of membership and upon the Registrar's books, and in all rosters shall be designated as members "by adoption", said members being entitled to all honors and privileges of this Association, except that of holding any office in the General Association, Division, or Chapter, except that of transmitting this honor to members of her family, only her children of a Confederate father. The honor dies with her if she has no children.

ARTICLE III

CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

Sec. 1.—Certificates of membership shall be issued by the Organization as soon as membership has been granted. Applicants shall fill out three application blanks, which shall be duly signed by Chapter officers after which they shall be sent to the Division Registrar, accompanied by the fee of one dollar. The Registrar, or her representative, shall send to the Registrar-General, who shall notify the Division Registrar of the applicant's enrollment; whereupon the Division Registrar shall return one paper to the Chapter President, which shall be final notice of the member's enrollment. The Registrar-General shall, from this record, when approved by her, fill out Certificates of Membership, which shall be signed by the President-General and herself. The Division Registrar shall sign the Certificate and forward to the Chapter President; the Chapter President, after signing the Certificate hereof, shall secure the Chapter Registrar's signature thereon. After the 1st of January, 1930, this Registrar-General shall determine the voting strength of a Chapter in a General Convention.

HISTORICAL PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY

Your Committee appointed to report on the term "Historical Proof", respectfully reports that proof must be authentic to be of value; and presents the following as what, in the opinion of the Committee, constitutes authentic proof of eligibility to membership in the United Daughters of the Confederacy:

- 1—Affidavit from Chairman, State Historical Commission; or
- 2—Certified proof from War Department, in Washington, D. C.; or
- 3—Affidavit from Director of C. of C. Chapter that the paper of applicant is exact copy of a registered C. of C. paper with certified proof of relationship to the same ancestor; or
- 4—Current history as recorded in some published work of recognized authenticity; or
- 5—Data from tombstone, location of grave being given; also relationship to ancestor may be proved by Probate records in matters pertaining to estates; or
- 6—A certified copy of a Confederate Veteran's pension application on which pension has been granted, with certified proof of applicant's relationship to pensioner; or
- 7—A certified copy of registered U. D. C. member's paper, provided it meets with the provision of the By-Laws as to eligibility and contains sufficient historical data, with certified proof of relationship to the same ancestor; or
- 8—A certified copy of ancestor's Cross of Honor application on which the Cross has been granted, with sworn statement of relationship to the receiver of the Cross; or
- 9—Sworn statement of one or more persons with positive knowledge, not hearsay, of "Material Aid" or "Civil Service" on which applicant bases eligibility, and a full account of the "Material Aid" must be given.
