WILLIS WASHINGTON DRISKILL, SR. (1866-aft.1920)

Willis Washington DRISKILL, son of Napoleon W. DRISKILL and Mary E. WALTON, was born April 1866 in Campbell County, Virginia. He married 20 June 1894 Mary B. HAAS, daughter of Thomas F. HAAS and Rosella S. FRANKLIN, of Bedford County, Virginia. Willis W. DRISKILL operated a general store at New London in Campbell County. Nothing further is known at present.

WILLIS WASHINGTON DRISKILL, JR. (1899-aft.1935)

Willis Washington DRISKILL, Jr., son of Willis Washington DRISKILL, Sr., and Mary B. HAAS, was born August 1899, in Campbell County, Virginia. In 1922, he was graduated from the Virginia Polytechnic Institute, in Blacksburg, Virginia, with a degree in electrical engineering. DRISKILL was a private in Company B and was a member of the Lynchburg Club, the American Institute of Electrical Engineers, the Camp Humphreys Club, the Senior Privates, and the Fallen Angels. In 1935, he was a resident of Norfolk, Virginia. Nothing further is known at present.
