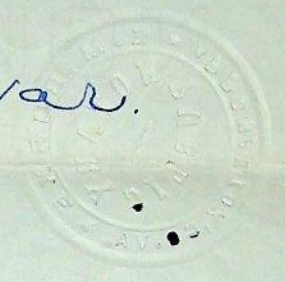

CONSTITUTION--MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE III

Sec. 1.—Those eligible to membership are boys and girls from infancy to eighteen years of age who are lineal descendants or nieces or grand nieces or nephews or grand nephews of the men and women who honorably served the Confederate States of America. Every child shall fill out three application papers, using the uniform blanks, setting forth his or her claims to membership, same to be approved by the parent Chapter, U. D. Every applicant must send twenty-five cents with his or her application for a certificate of membership which is furnished by the Third Vice-President-General.
