I feel that you will be interested in the present status of the WPA Project for a custodian of the Lynchburg City Museum. You will recall that on 6/28/38, this office received final approval on a supplement to the above mentioned project of \$677.00. This approval was given with the understanding that it would be the last available funds for such a type of project. The Works Progress Administration feels that they have assisted in establishing this work and that it has now become a matter of current work which is normally taken care of by the sponsor.

The present funds should last through June 15, 1939. It was originally contemplated that these funds would last through June 30, but an increase in wages was made last August and this has exhausted these funds somewhat more rapidly than was anticipated.

From our point of view we feel that this has been a very worth while project and very successfully operated. We feel that it has been a privilege to participate in such a type of project.
