Death of Samuel Waldron.

Mr. Samuel Waldron, an aged and highly respected citizen, died yesterday morning at 4 o'clock at his home on Locust street, after a long illness. For many months, he had been in declining health, and his condition was such that no hope for his recovery was entertained. Mr. Waldron was about 80 years of age, and he had been a resident of Lynchburg for about fifty years. For a long time his place of residence was on Grace street, between Kinnier's store and the Presbyterian cemetery, and near his home was a small frame building in which for many years he conducted a cabinet and furniture repair shop. In all his dealings, he was characterized by strict honesty, absolute integrity, and perfect uprightness. He was a devoted member of the Methodist Protestant church. He was twice married, and is survived by his second wife and several children.
