The Lynchburg Branch of the American Association of University Women was organized in October 1921 when Mrs. Robert M. Woodson and Mrs. Powell Glass called together a group of college women for the purpose of forming such a branch. Miss Gillie A. LAREW, Ph.D., mathematics professor at Randolph-Macon Woman's College, was elected as first president. The purpose of the organization was to "unite college women in raising and maintaining standards of education and in promoting an interest in civic affairs and better international understanding." Membership in the organization is open to women who are graduates of colleges accredited by the American Association of University Women. The group has encouraged adult studies and vocational training and has established scholarships and fellowships for students.

The Lynchburg Branch has established a local scholarship, has contributed each year toward international fellowships, and has taken part in round table discussions for peace problems. It has also endeavored to influence Lynchburg girls to go to college and has organized for members and non-members study groups in cultural subjects.

The Lynchburg Branch conducted an annual book sale to raise funds for its scholarship activities for a number of years.
