

Name Joseph Edward Purvie rendered the following

Confederate Service: (Copied from authentic source such as accepted histories, State and County Records, family records, contemporary accounts, letters, etc)

The following are excerpts from a diary kept by my grandfather, Joseph E. Purvie, while a prisoner of war at Fort Delaware, Del. It was kept from July 3, 1863 through Aug. 31, 1863. It was lost at Point Lookout, Md. and found by G. Edwin Nye, Co. E. Third Maine Regiment Infantry, Auburn, Maine, and returned to grandfather several years after the war. Mr. Nye had been in command of the Hospital Guard at Point Lookout. He got in touch with grandfather by inserting an advertisement in the Dispatch. I have the diary and the clipping in my possession.

The little book has on the front cover the following: "Joseph E. Purvie, Co. G., 19th Va. Regt. Bought in Chambersburg, Franklin Co. Pa. June 30, 1863."

I have chosen several entries that have historical significance. The first entry is July 3, 1863

July 3: I was in a severe battle today and was taken prisoner - was slightly wounded. Nine of my company were taken besides myself, including Captain Boyd.

July 5: Came to Baltimore today. Arrived here about dark. Rained again last night and we are without shelter. There are about three thousand of us here.

July 6: Left Baltimore on a steamer for Fort Delaware.

July 7: Arrived at the fort this morning. I am very hungry this morning, but there is not much prospect of one getting anything.

July 9: I am still confined in this wretched place. I often heard of Fort Delaware but never expected to be confined in the place as a prisoner of war. The fort is on a small island of about eighty acres of land and about a mile from the mainland. It is a place of considerable strength. I think

July 21: Two years ago today the first Battle of Manassas was fought. Our Regt., about this time in the evening was after those Yankees and they were retreating as fast as they could.

July 22: Today has been warm and dull. Our water is out. I wish it would rain again. I expect we will suffer, or drink river water and that is salty. Some of the boys have been drinking it today.

July 28: Nothing of any note happened today. One of our men was killed last night attempting to swim the river. He belonged to the prisoners that were taken at Vicksburg.

July 30: The Yankees sent seven hundred of our sick to City Point and I think they are going to send some more in the morning. I think we will get away in the course of ten days. (Note: Grandfather was paroled for exchange Feb. 18, 1865, nearly 2 years after the diary was written.)

Aug. 1: Our boys are getting sick very fast now.

Aug. 18: It is very cold this morning. I was uncomfortable last night, not having anything to put over me.

Aug. 21: A great many of our boys have taken the oath. About two thousand, I believe. Oh, what a shame!

Aug. 29: The Yankees are giving us blankets. They give one blanket to two men.

Aug. 31: I did not expect to be here this long. If they keep us here this winter we will all freeze. More than a third of the men that came here are dead. Eight or nine die every day.

The entries end abruptly here. On the last page is a list of the men from Co. G. who were with him. They are: Capt. J. M. Boyd, J. E. Purvie (he included his own name) J. J. Loring, J. Harvey, C. P. Dillard, L. P. Purhee, J. E. Loring, J. Hamilton, A. Stevens, Wm. H. Porter, W. H. Whitehead, Wm. Johnson.

Grandfather was given a furlough, soon after his release. He was walking from Nelson Co. enroute to Appomattox, on April 9, to be join his Co. He met Federal soldiers who told him Lee had surrendered.

G, 19th Virginia Infantry Regiment, known as "Nelson Grays", Nelson Co. commanded by Captain Thomas M. Boyd; that he enlisted May 1, 1861, Massies Mill... Signed Wilmer L. Hall, M. H. P. State Librarian.

From War Dept, the Adjutant's Office, Washington, D.C., June 2, 1943

The records show that Joseph E. Purvie, name not found as Joseph Edward Purvie, a Corporal and Sergeant of Captain Thomas M. Boyd's Company (Nelson Grays), which subsequently became Co. G, 19th Regiment Virginia Infantry, Confederate States Army, enlisted May 1, 1861 at Massies Mill, Nelson County, Virginia, age 20 years. The company muster roll for July and August, 1864, dated October, 1864, last on file, shows him absent, prisoner of war.

Union prisoner of war records show that he was captured at Gettysburg July 3, 1863, imprisoned at Fort Delaware, Delaware, and Point Lookout, Maryland, where he was paroled February 18, 1865 for exchange. Received at Boulware's & Cox Wharf, James River, about February 20, 1865, by Confederate Agent for Exchange.

His name appears on a Muster Roll of a detachment of paroled and exchanged prisoners at Camp Lee, near Richmond, Va., dated Feb. 28, 1865, which shows him present. No later record of him has been found. The collection of Confederate States Army records on file in this Dept. is incomplete, and the failure to find the complete or any record of any person there on is by no means conclusive proof that

each person did not serve at some place that is not on the records. It is possible, however, that some persons were not included in the records.

7—A certified copy of ancestor's Cross of Honor application on which the Cross has been granted, provided it contains authentic proof of Confederate service, with sworn statement of relationship to the receiver of the Cross.

BY-LAWS—MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE I.

Membership.—Those women not less than sixteen years of age who are eligible to membership are the widows, wives, sisters, nieces, grand-nieces and lineal descendants of such men as served honorably in the Confederate Army, Navy or Civil Service, or of those men unfit for active duty who loyally gave aid to the Cause, and such women who are the lineal descendants of those members whose papers are correctly registered.

Northern women having no male relative who served the Confederate States of America in the War Between the States, 1861-65 and having themselves performed no special service to same, but having married a Confederate soldier since 1865 and through this means becoming a member of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, shall have the words "by adoption" placed upon their certificate of membership and upon the Registrar's books and in all rosters shall be designated "by adoption", said members being entitled to all honors and privileges of this organization, except that of voting, holding office in the General Organization, Division or Chapter and that of transmitting this honor to members of her family, except to her children of a Confederate father. The honor dies with her if she has no children.

Irregular members (those members admitted upon records of in-laws, cousins, or through records which did not entitle them to membership) shall be entitled to all honors and privileges of this organization except holding an office or chairmanship in the General Organization.

CERTIFICATE OF MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE VIII.

Section 1. Certificates shall be issued by the Registrar-General to Division Presidents, and Chapter Presidents where there are no Divisions, as soon as eligibility has been proven, provided the Initiation Fee, Certificate Fee and per-capita tax have been paid.

Applicants shall fill out three application blanks, giving the full name of Confederate ancestor or relative, giving an authentic record of his service in the Confederate States Army, Navy, Civil Service, or Material Aid rendered the Southern Confederacy. This service shall be verified by one of the seven Rules of Eligibility as given in Art. I, to substantiate the claim of eligibility. All papers must be certified to before a Notary.

The application shall be duly signed by Chapter Officers named in blanks, giving the date of admission to Chapter. Each applicant shall sign her petition for membership giving her full name and married name (if married), and correct address.

All applications shall be sent to the Registrar-General, through the Division Registrar after they are recorded, accompanied by \$1.25 for Initiation Fee, 25 cents Certificate of Membership and 20 cents additional for per-capita tax.

ELIGIBILITY

Those ELIGIBLE for membership are women not less than 16 years of age who are lineal or collateral descendants (wives, sisters, daughters, granddaughters, nieces) of men and women who served honorably in the Army, Navy, or Civil Service of the Confederate States of America, or gave material aid to the cause; and women who are lineal descendants of members or former members of the organization, provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the organization.

No applicant whose ancestor took the Oath of Allegiance prior to April 9, 1865 shall be considered eligible.

MEMBERSHIP

ADMISSION TO MEMBERSHIP shall be through a chapter.

An applicant for MEMBERSHIP shall be endorsed by two members of a chapter in good standing to whom the applicant is personally known. She shall be accepted for membership as prescribed in the chapter by-laws and shall be sent application blanks in triplicate.

The applicant shall fill out three U. D. C. application blanks, giving full name of Confederate ancestor or relative with authentic proof of his service and have papers notarized with seal.

The completed applications shall be returned to chapter registrar, accompanied by the required fees and dues, and after being properly signed and dated by chapter officers, shall be sent to the Registrar-General through the Division Registrar.

If the application is approved, the member shall be registered; one copy of application being filed in the Business Office, and two copies returned to Division Registrar who shall file one copy and return one copy to Chapter Registrar. This shall constitute notice of enrollment.

In chapters where there is no Division, the chapter registrar shall send papers, fees and dues to the Registrar-General.

A member admitted on or after September 1, shall be credited for the next succeeding Calendar year.

REFUNDS. If applications are not approved, all fees and dues shall be returned to the applicant, with the exception of \$1.00 to cover costs of mailing. (Chapters may reimburse applicant in full.)

CERTIFICATE OF MEMBERSHIP

CERTIFICATES. Each registered member shall be entitled to a Certificate of Membership, duly attested by the President-General and Registrar-General, to which shall be attached the Seal of the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

Eligibility

Section 1:

- a. Those eligible for Active membership are women no less than sixteen years of age who are blood descendants, lineal or collateral, of men and women who served honorably in the Army, Navy, or Civil Service of the Confederate States of America, or gave Material Aid to the Cause. HISTORICAL PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY

Your Committee appointed to report on the term "Historical Proof", respectfully reports that proof must be authentic to be of value; and presents the following as what, in the opinion of the Committee, constitutes authentic proof of eligibility to membership in the United Daughters of the Confederacy:

- 1—Affidavit from Chairman, State Historical Commission; or
- 2—Certified proof from War Department, in Washington, D. C.; or
- 3—Affidavit from Director of C. of C. Chapter that the paper of applicant is exact copy of a registered C. of C. paper with certified proof of relationship to the same ancestor; or
- 4—Current history as recorded in some published work of recognized authenticity; or
- 5—Data from tombstone, location of grave being given; also relationship to ancestor may be proved by Probate records in matters pertaining to estates; or
- 6—A certified copy of a Confederate Veteran's pension application on which pension has been granted, with certified proof of applicant's relationship to pensioner; or
- 7—A certified copy of registered U. D. C. member's paper, provided it meets with the provision of the By-Laws as to eligibility and contains sufficient historical data, with certified proof of relationship to the same ancestor; or
- 8—A certified copy of ancestor's Cross of Honor application on which the Cross has been granted, with sworn statement of relationship to the receiver of the Cross; or
- 9—Sworn statement of one or more persons with positive knowledge, not hearsay, of "Maternal Aid" or "Civil Service" on which applicant bases eligibility, and a full account of the "Maternal Aid" must be given.

BY-LAWS—MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE I.

Sec. 1—Those women not less than 18 years of age entitled to membership are the women who are the widows, wives, mothers, sisters, nieces, grand nieces, and lineal descendants of such men as served honorably in the Confederate Army, Navy, or Civil Service, or of those men unfit for active duty who loyally gave aid to the Cause. Also Southern women who can give proof of personal service or loyal aid to the Southern Cause during the war, and lineal descendants or nieces of such women wherever living. Northern women having no male relative who served the Confederate States of America in the War between the States, 1861-1865, and having themselves performed no special service to same, but having married a Confederate soldier since 1865, and through this means becoming a member of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, shall have the words, "by adoption" placed upon their certificates of membership and upon the Registrar's books, and in all rosters shall be designated as members "by adoption", said members being entitled to all honors and privileges of this Association, except that of holding any office in the General Association, Division, or Chapter, except that of transmitting this honor to members of her family, only her children of a Confederate father. The honor dies with her if she has no children.

ARTICLE III.

CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

Sec. 1—Certificates of membership shall be issued by the Organization as soon as membership has been granted. Applicants shall fill out three application blanks, which shall be duly signed by Chapter officers, after which they shall be sent to the Division Registrar, accompanied by the fee of twenty-five cents for Certificate of Membership. Division Registrar shall sign and record applications, shall send to the Registrar-General, who shall notify the Division Registrar of the applicant's enrollment; whereupon the Division Registrar shall return one paper to the Chapter President, which shall be final notice of the member's enrollment. The Registrar-General shall, from this record, when approved by her, fill out Certificates of Membership, which shall be signed by the President-General and herself. The Division President shall sign the Certificate and forward to the Chapter President; the Chapter President, after signing the Certificate herself, shall secure the Registrar's signature to the Certificate, and deliver same to member. After 1920 this registration is necessary to determine the voting strength of a Chapter in a General Convention.
