My dear Mrs. Speiden,

Your letter and papers came to me this morning. I am always glad to get papers and particularly well filled out blanks.

This "New Ruling" is generally misunderstood and I am constantly returning checks so I am going to have some letter slips printed explaining it. I didn't understand it either so I wrote to our Reg. Gen. to explain to me so I could give it out properly. It is as follows:

The initiation fee of \$1.25 is to be sent to the Division Treasurer by the Chapter Treasurer with the name of the New Member typed (2 copies) on blanks used for the per capita tax. Mark the name New Member. Division Treas keeps one copy of list and the Treasurer General keeps one copy. The per capita tax of 20¢ is sent with initiation fee when member joins.

Do not send fee or tax until papers are returned by Division Registrar to the Chapter as accepted and Registered by Registrar-General. —

One dollar is charged for a demit. 50¢ is kept by Chapter issuing demit. and 50¢ is sent with the blanks

to the Chapter receiving the applicant to be sent to
Div. Registrar to go to Registrar General -

Mrs. Gillman's papers have war record copied on them
but the record from Washington wasn't attached. I would like
for you to send me that. See pages 7 & 8 ^{in little "Red Book"} It is required -

I sometimes write for it rather than write to the Registrar
but since it has been gotten we might as well use it -

If you can get John Gillman's middle name, please send
me that - It may be he hasn't one - then I would like
for the applicant to say there is none -

Just as you say I shouldn't be surprised if this
initiation fee doesn't keep out some members -

This cold I have & the warm spell makes me lazy, but
I want you to have this check right away so you can
send me the 50¢ for certificate. but hope you can
guess at what I am wanting to say -

Dear Mrs. Speiden,

Your card just received today. I am sorry the papers were late in reaching you - suppose you have them ere this. Mrs. Porter wrote me not to send her any papers until after the Convention. I was visiting my son in Norfolk & was called from there on the 15th Nov. to attend funeral of my brother in Danville on 16th. I went then to my daughter in Chase City for a visit and was called from there here on the 20th ^{to my daughter}. There was a hemorrhage on the brain & Dr. scrubbed her recovery. Being frail anyway and high blood pressure she has been ill. Just beginning to sit up & walk about the room some. This morning she had a dizzy spell & had to

sit down quickly. I got my papers
off in time, but in a hurry I failed
to put Mrs. Porter's Hotel address in
portsmouth - she is living there this winter -
and the Express Co. held them some time
before advising me they couldn't find her.
I went at once to office ^{her} and got it
straightened out and papers have been
sent out. I am sorry but hope things will
move along on schedule time hereafter.

I dare say many of my women have been
wondering. I was wondering if I had got
it everything wrong + Mrs. Porter was won-
dering why she didn't get my report.

I have had a terrible beginning in this work -
but I hope the clouds are lifting and the silver
lining will soon appear in full. My grand-
daughter has been in bed twice since her mother
has been sick. I haven't been to church for
two months except at night - but I hope
all will soon be well and I can keep
the work in good shape. With best wishes

My dear Mrs. Spudis,

est sympathy - my daughter here has been in
poor health - practically all of her life, and
is in bed again now under physicians
treatment - Now you have the papers of these
ladies certified & returned - put them to work
but do not forget to turn names into Bri-
tains - Do not wait for certificates they will
get them all right - When I joined several
years ago - my certificate was some months
coming to me - They would tell me "your papers
have gone through, you are a member & your
certificate will come" - I cannot do anything
to expedite matters - could not make any sugges-
tions to our Reg. Gen. I am sure she is work-
ing as hard as she can - My state job is a
big one - hers is much bigger -

I am planning to go to Fredericksburg & want to meet you. I do hope we will have good weather. Any time I can help

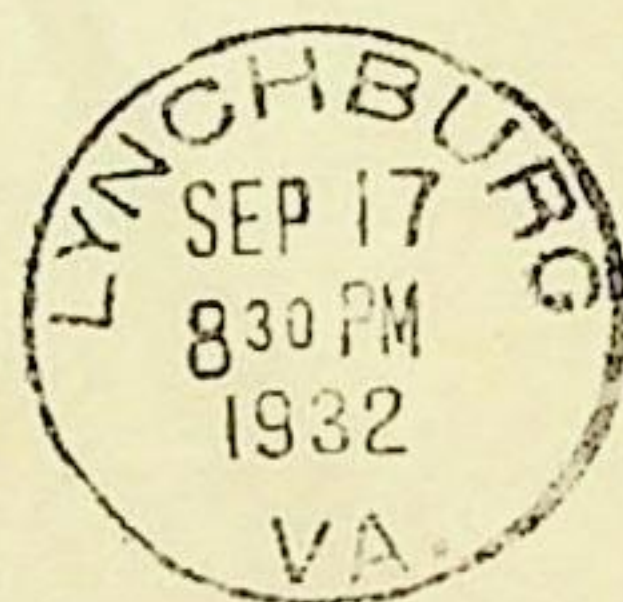
you let me know. But I am leav-
