JAMES JAY CARRINGTON (1930-2021)

James Jay Carrington was born 4 September 1930 in Cortland, New York, the son of Kenneth Edward Carrington and Ruth Ester Nye. He graduated from the State University of New York College at Cortland in 1953 and was employed by General Electric as a technical writer for mobile two-way radio products. In 1959, he moved with the Mobile Radio Division of General Electric to Lynchburg, Virginia. He retired as a marketing specialist in 1990 and worked for L.M. Ericsson Company as sales training manager until his retirement in 1995.

Jim had been active in music and theater since his days in New York. In Lynchburg, he was a soloist at a local church and active in the Little Theater. He was a charter member of the Diamond Hill Historical Society, served as President of the Lynchburg Historical Foundation, the Diamond Hill Historical Society, the Sarah Winston Henry Chapter of the APVA, and the Keep Lynchburg Beautiful Commission. He also served as treasurer of Friends of the Lynchburg Public Library. He was a member of several genealogical societies. He also founded two newsletters, View from the Terrace and Diamond Hill News.

Carrington studied voice with Ruth Dowd at SUNY and with Florence Vickland and Crane Caulder in Lynchburg. In 1973, he founded the Lynchburg Early Music Consort that presented concerts of medieval and renaissance music for many years. He also taught recorder playing at Lynchburg College.

With his partner, Robert E. Brown, Jim founded Diamond Hill Associates to renovate old buildings in the Diamond Hill neighborhood and to provide decent housing for inner-city families of moderate income.

James Jay Carrington died 2 August 2021 in Lynchburg. His ashes were buried in the Nye family lot at Old McLean Cemetery, McLean, New York.
