

GENERAL ORDER DEPARTMENT

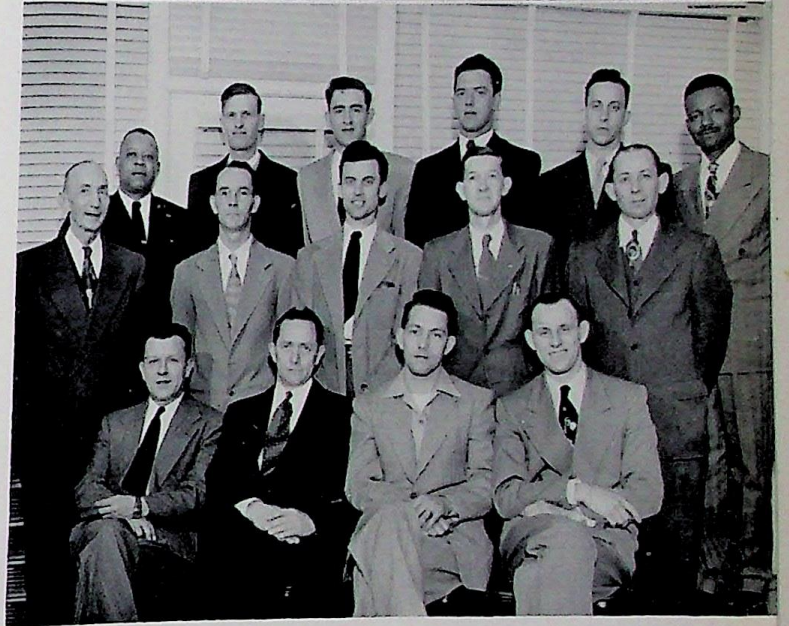
This is the final assembly point. Here orders are completed, packed and forwarded by spiral chute to the basement six floors below for delivery.

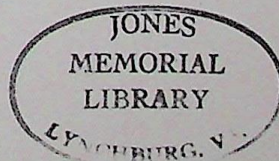
